2017 PASER Training Distress Identification Webinar

June 1, 2017

All raters must attend the PASER Distress Identification Training (Part 1). Training is provided through this webinar.

Every year, local agencies must collect Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) data on at least 50% of their Federal-aid-eligible roads, and then submit the data to the Transportation Asset Management Council (TAMC). Agencies can also apply to the TAMC for grants to fund the data collection of paved non-Federal-aid roads if they are trained.

The Center for Technology & Training (CTT) will be conducting its final PASER Training webinar and a PASER Training comprehensive course (covers webinar and on-site material) on behalf of the TAMC in 2017. New raters who plan to evaluate Federal-aid-eligible roads in 2017 must have attended the both the webinar and on-site portion.
