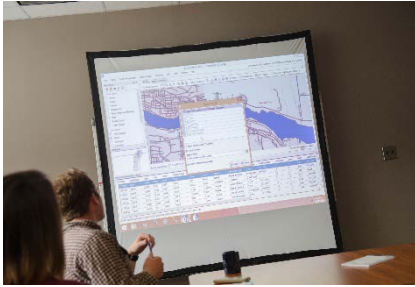


Internship in Software Engineering



Software Engineering Intern

Software engineers are responsible for developing software, writing, and maintaining the code base, testing software, and continuous development.

Key responsibilities:

- Bug fixes
- Small feature implementations
- Upgrading existing features
- Upgrade legacy code patterns to current
- Test code changes
- Record tickets based on errors found in testing or observed in code

Additional responsibilities:

- Release testing
- Tech support

All positions are paid. Year-round positions open with a minimum of 10 hours/week during the academic year and up to 40 hours/week during the summer.
